## Do You Know...the value of an investment in higher education?

According to the College Board's Education Pays 2023, full-time workers ages 25 and older with a bachelor's degree earned a median income in 2021 of \$73,300, over 65% more than the \$44,300 earned by a full-time worker with only a high school diploma. Those with master's degrees earned a median income of \$87,300, which rose to \$121,600 for those with a professional degree.

As further proof of the value of an investment in higher education, Education Pays 2023 reports that "in 2021, among full-time year-round workers between the ages of 25 and 34, median earnings for women with at least a bachelor's degree were \$60,540, compared with \$34,590 for those with a high school diploma. Median earnings for men with at least a bachelor's degree were \$75,430, compared with \$42,460 for those with a high school diploma."
